12th Grade College Planning Checklist

Narrow your list of colleges to 5 to 10 top schools
These should be colleges that you want to apply to
Create a master calendar of events, deadlines and major dates
☐ Test dates
College application dates
Remember to do these early, you do not want to wait last minute
If you were not happy with you scores or want to try to improve on your scores,
retake the SAT
☐ Additional coursework that you learned during the end of junior year could
help boost your scores
You already know what the test is like and what to expect, another attempt
can not negatively impact you
Send your SAT scores in
Be sure to have your scores sent to the colleges you are applying to
Complete the FAFSA form
The first day to fill this form out is October 1st
Early decision/action or rolling admission applications begin early- November 1st
Get those applications started and completed first
For application essays have a teacher or family member proof read
Do not wait until the day before it is due to have a teacher proofread
Keep active in school
Both inside and outside the classroom
These grades do matter for colleges
Visit your final college before accepting
Notify a college with either an acceptance or rejection by May 1st at the latest
Send your deposit to only one school
Ask your high school to send your official transcript to your college
Paview all financial aid awards
